- Introduce a fund for pedestrian crossings in the county to improve active travel and make people feel safe
- Introduce cameras to catch drivers who jump red lights or cause accidents at hotspot junctions
- Support local cycling schemes that make a real difference to the casual cyclist, not just cycle super-highways




Improving public transport


